## Analytical skills (A1-A4)

- 4. **Recognise** and **evaluate** the historical contexts/origins of social scientific ideas, principles, methods, and tools.

## Interdisciplinary thinking (I1-I3)

- 5. **Identify** and **critically assess** causal claims in social scientific explanations.
- 6. Interrogate the demarcation of social science disciplines.
- 7. **Investigate** complex social issues, integrating insights from across a range of disciplines and methodological approaches.

## Leadership and teamworking skills (LT1-LT2)

- 8. **Design** and **manage** a collaborative project, working effectively as part of a diverse team.
- 9. Collaborate with peers to build consensus and accomplish shared goals.
